FOSSTON, Minn. — Adele Carr, 69, Fosston, died Wednesday, Feb. 27, 2002, in MeritCare Hospital, Fargo, as a result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident near Lengby, Minn.

Beatrice Adele Stewart was born Aug. 25, 1932, the daughter of William and Ruth (Nybladh) Stewart, in Oslo, Minn. She grew up in Angus, Minn., and graduated from high school in Warren, Minn. She attended UND, graduating with a dual bachelor's degree in vocal performance and music education, and a minor in English. She was with the Denver Colorado Opera Company. She taught school in Oklee, Minn. She married Eugene Carr on June 3, 1952, in Warren. They moved to Mound, Minn., in 1956. She worked for the Hennepin County Superintendent's Office as a traveling music teacher. They purchased the Hillsboro (N.D.) Banner newspaper, the Hatton (N.D.) Free Press and the Steele County Press, Finley, N.D. She worked for the Hillsboro school system as a music and English teacher and worked at the newspaper. She was the first paid employee of the Hillsboro beet sugar processing plant. They sold the newspapers in 1971. She was the secretary of the North Dakota Newspaper Association. They moved to Grand Forks before moving to Minneapolis in 1983. She worked as a secretary for the American Newspaper's Representatives, the advertising division of the National Newspaper Association. They purchased the 13 Towns Newspaper in Fosston, in 1988. They sold it in 1997 and continued working for the newspaper until their retirement in 1999.

She is survived by her husband; sons, David (Barbara), Lengby, and Peter, Fosston; daughters, Nancy (Kip) Kaler, Fargo, and Susan (Duane) Borgeson, Little Falls, Minn.; five grandchildren; and a sister, Jean (Walt) Ensinger, Grants Pass, Ore.

She was preceded in death by her parents; and a sister, Joyce.
