Alberta S. Arnold, 91, Grand Forks, North Dakota died Saturday, May 15, 2004, at Valley Memorial Eldercare Center in Grand Forks, North Dakota.

Alberta was born on March 24, 1913 near Hamilton, North Dakota the daughter of Philip and Caroline Stalidt. She graduated from the Hamilton High School in 1930. She was the manager/operator of the Hamilton Telephone Company for several years. Alberta graduated from the Deaconess School of Nursing at Grand Forks in 1935. She worked as a home visiting nurse for both Grand Forks County and the City of Grand Forks. In 1937 she was the Pierce County Public Health Nurse living in Ruby, North Dakota.

She married Raymond Arnold on June 9, 1940 at the home of her sister Lydia Restemayer in Cavalier, North Dakota. They moved to Grand Forks where she served as the Grand Forks County Health Nurse from 1940 to 1945. Alberta was very active in the American Red Cross and received recognition for over 60 years volunteer service with the National & Local American Red Cross. She has taught high school adult classes in home nursing & mother baby care, provided private duty nursing services, served on the Red River Valley Chapter of American Red Cross Board and was secretary for 6 years. Albert was serving on the board when Deaconess and St. Michael's Hospitals merged and United Hospital was built. She has received the Community Spirit Award and encouraged many girls to enter nursing.

She is survived by her two children, Cheryl (Robert) Foeltz of Horace, North Dakota, James 'Buzz' Arnold of Grand Forks, North Dakota, two grandchildren, Julie M. Foeltz of Temple, Texas and Edward Raymond Foeltz of Ames, Iowa.

She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, Raymond, a son, Raymond Jr., a brother Edward and three sisters, Helen Black, Josephine Restemayer & Lydia Restemayer.
