Alfred William Eisner was born Jan. 22, 1922, in Cleveland, the son of William and Julia Eisner. He moved to Grand Forks with his family in 1931, and moved to Inkster, N.D., in 1932, where he grew up and attended schools. He joined the U.S. Army and served in New Guinea, East Indies, southern Philippines, and Luzon during World War II. He received a Purple Heart for wounds suffered in action. He returned to Grand Forks and worked as a truck driver for Nash Finch Co., and later Grand Forks Air Force Base, before retiring in 1968.
