Funeral services for Dewey Cady, 74, 1215 Fourth Ave. N., active in city bowling for 46 years, will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday at Grace Baptist Church with Rev. John Thielenhaus officiating. Burial will be in Memorial Park Cemetery. Military honors will be provided by the National Guard.

Visitation will be Friday evening at the Hanson-Anderson Home and at the church for one hour before the services.

Mr. Cady, who died Tuesday, was born May 5, 1898, at Grand Forks. He attended local schools and the University of North Dakota. He served in the Army during World War I.

He was employed by Standard Oil until 1940 and was later a car inspector for the Great Northern Railway until his retirement in 1965.

Mr. Cady was a member of the World War I Barracks, member of the 700 Bowler Club and secretary of the Grand Forks Bowling Association. He

was a member of Grace Baptist Church.
