

Dorothy (Dora) Thompson

Dora Thompson (age 97) died March 3, 2001, in Grand Forks, N.D.

Dorothy Margaret was born May 10, 1903, the daughter of John and Aime (Henkel) Ault, in Cavalier at the John Ault farm. She attended Cavalier High School and married Homer Thompson on June 10, 1922. They farmed in the Cavalier area and had retail businesses in Cavalier and Warren, Minn. The family moved to Tacoma, WA, during World War II, and Dora supported the war effort by working in the defense industry building planes and ships.
