Helen Woutat, 51, a long time resident of Grand Forks ND died peacefully in her sleep Tuesday, October 24, 2006, in St. Paul, MN.



Helen McIntosh was born on May 29, 1915 the daughter of Alex and Evelyn (Smith) McIntosh in Cavalier, ND. She graduated

from high school in Cavalier, and then attended Mayville State Teachers College for two years, leaving in 1934 to work at the F.C. Masee-Law Office in East Grand Forks, MN.
