John Hippe, 82, Dies Sunday

John Hippe, 82, 1844 Riverside Drive, a newspaper pressman in Grand Forks for 46 years, died Sunday at a local hospital.

Mr. Hippe had retired in 1953 as press foreman of the Grand Forks Herald after 41 years service and was previously a pressman for five years with the former Grand Forks Evening Times.

Funeral arrangements are incomplete.

Mr. Hippe was born Sept. 14, 1887, at Adams, Minn. He was raised and educated there and moved to Grand Forks as a young man. He did odd jobs around a saw mill that was located here and in 1906 went to work for the former Normanden Publishing Co. In 1907, he joined the Evening Times which was located at the corner of N. Third Street and Second Avenue and later moved across the street to the first-floor of the Dinnie Building.

The Evening Times was merged into the Grand Forks Herald in October 1912 and Mr. Hippe became a Herald pressman. He was appointed press foreman in 1926 and held the post until retiring in April, 1953.

Mr. Hippe never married.

He had served as president of the Grand Forks Pressman's Union Local 192 for 23 consecutive years before retiring.

Mr. Hippe was noted for his color photography hobby which specialized in lake scenery.

Surviving are one brother, Louis Hippe, Brainerd, Minn., and one sister, Miss Nettie Hippe, Grand Forks.

A twin sister, Mrs. Clement Hegge, died in 1969.
