

Mrs. J. Weaver Dies Here At 67

Mrs. John Weaver, 67, 408 N. Eighth St., died here Thursday.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Monday at Augustana Lutheran Church with Rev. Nathan G. Lundgren officiating. Burial will be in Memorial Park Cemetery. The body will lie in state Sunday afternoon and evening at Hanson-Anderson Mortuary and Monday at the church for one hour before the time of services.



Mrs. Weaver, the former Josie Zahnow, was born Dec. 6, 1902, at Appleton, Minn. She grew up and was educated at Appleton.

Mrs. Weaver married John Weaver on April 8, 1919, at Devils Lake, N.D. They celebrated their golden wedding anniversary in 1969.

Following their marriage, they lived at Devils Lake and in 1928 moved to Grand Forks. They have lived here since. Her husband served for 40 years with the former Great Northern Railway, now known as the Burlington Northern, before retiring.
