

Linus J. Sande

Funeral services for Linus J. Sande, 77, owner-operator of the Grand Forks Marble and Granite Co., who died here Friday, will be held Monday at 1:30 p.m. at United Lutheran Church. Rev. Oscar A. Jordahl will officiate.

Burial will be in Memorial Park Cemetery.

The body will lie in state at Hanson-Anderson Mortuary this afternoon and evening and at the church an hour before the service. Military honors will be conferred at the graveside by members of World War One Barracks.

Pallbearers will be Arthur Tweet, Robert B. Lee, Steven Itner, J. B. Shawhan, Dr. John Lunseth and John McLaughlin.

Mr. Sande, formerly of 312 13th Ave. S., was a resident of the Valley Memorial Home at the time of his death.

He was born at Stevens Point, Wis., Oct. 25, 1893. He moved with his parents to Reynolds, N.D. The family later came to Grand Forks, then moved to Nashboro, N.D., where Mr. Sande attended school.

Mr. Sande later came to Grand Forks, where he attended Aaker's Business College. He was then employed at Washington, D.C., until enlisting in the United States Army during World War I.

After serving in the army, he returned to Grand Forks, where he married the former Ingeborg Lunseth on Aug. 20, 1919. She died Nov. 2, 1961.

Mr. Sande founded the Grand Forks Marble and Granite Co., in 1909 and operated the business until his death.

He was a member of United Lutheran Church, Sons of Norway Lodge, Monument Builders of North America, and Northwest Monument Builders.
