

Mrs. G. Murphy Dies At Age 67

Mrs. Garrett J. Murphy, 67, Seattle, Wash., formerly of Grand Forks, died unexpectedly Wednesday at a local hospital, a few hours after being admitted.

Mrs. Murphy had arrived in Grand Forks on June 8 to visit relatives and had planned to leave for her home in Seattle on Thursday.

Funeral services will be held here at 10 a.m. Saturday at United Lutheran Church with Rev. Erling H. Wold officiating.

Burial will be in Memorial Park Cemetery.

The body will lie in state here Friday afternoon and evening at the Grand Forks Norman Funeral Home and Saturday at the church for one hour before the time of services.

Mrs. Murphy, the former Louise Johnson, was born April 11, 1903, in Sullivan Township, rural East Grand Forks. Mrs. Murphy was educated in the Grand Forks schools.

She married Garrett J. Murphy in 1925 in Grand Forks.

Mr. Murphy was employed here with the Burlington Northern railroad and later transferred to Seattle in 1938. They had moved there where Mr. Murphy was a brakeman for the railroad until retiring.

Mrs. Murphy was a member of the Phinney Ridge Lutheran Church and the American Lutheran Church Women of the church and a member of the North Dakota Club at Seattle.

Surviving are her husband; two sons, Robert and John Murphy, Seattle; two brothers, Albert C., Hatton, N.D., and Wilfred Johnson, Grand Forks; one sister, Mrs. W. H. (Hilda) Goodwater, Grand Forks and five grandchildren.

One sister, Mrs. J. A. (Gertrude) Grimmer, died in 1965.
