Funeral services for Mrs. Glenn Carr, 67, 11½ N. Fourth St., who died Saturday in Minneapolis, where she had been hospitalized for six weeks, will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday at United Lutheran Church. Rev. Wayne Stark will officiate. Burial will be in Memorial Park Cemetery.

The former Marie Berkeland was born June 9, 1906, in Walle Township near Thompson, N.D., on the farm homesteaded by her grandfather in 1870. She attended rural schools and graduated from Grand Forks Central High School in 1922. She received a teacher's certificate from Mayville, N.D., State College and taught in rural Grand Forks schools.

She married Glenn Carr in 1929 at Grand Forks. He was with the buildings and grounds department at the University of North Dakota. The couple moved to Warren, Minn.; in 1946 and Mr. Carr was in the plumbing and heating business. Mrs. Carr returned to Grand Forks in 1954 following the death of her husband. She was employed for a number of years by Willey's Jewelry.

She is survived by two sons, Eugene, Hillsboro, N.D., and Thomas, Sacramento, Calif.; one daughter, Mrs. David (Margaret) Stolle, Minneapolis; seven grandchildren; four sisters, Mrs. Otis (Agnes) Faulkner, and Mrs. Donald (Bessie) Walsh, both of Grand Forks, Mrs. Larry (Alma) Biggle and Mrs. Don (Ruby) Moal, both of Oakland, Calif.; two brothers, Carl, Thompson, and Arnold, Salem, Ore.
