Milton E. Moskau, 92, Bismarck, formerly of Grand Forks, died Tuesday, April 16, 2002, in Missouri Slope Lutheran Care Center.

Milton Moskau was born Sept. 15, 1909, the son of Gilbert and Hannah (Brotten) Moskau, in Mayville, N.D. He grew up and attended school in Grand

Forks. He graduated from UND in 1933. He began his law career in private practice in Grand Forks in 1933. In 1958, he joined the staff of the American Bar Association in Chicago in Judicial Administration as associate director of the Joint Committee for the Effective Administration of Justice. In 1963, he was appointed a special assistant attorney general for North Dakota in Bismarck as counsel for the Workers Compensation Bureau and Social Service Board of North Dakota. On retirement from this position, he was appointed Administrative Law Hearing officer for Appeals to the Department of Human Services of North Dakota. He married Alice Evans on Dec. 28, 1936, in Missoula, Mont. She died Dec. 2, 1992. He was a charter member of Calvary Lutheran Church, Grand Forks.

He is survived by a son, Mike (Linda), Golden, Colo.; daughters, Marilyn Romsaas, Bismarck, and Judy Schumacher, Grand Forks; five grandchildren; and 10 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a sister, Gladys Moskau.
