



### **O. Lewis Ugland**

O. Lewis Ugland, 89, Grand Forks, died Sunday June 2, 2002 in Valley Eldercare Center.

Lewis Ugland was born April 8, 1913, the son of Gunder and Amanda (Aaserud) Ugland in Crary, North Dakota. He moved with his family to Mayville, North Dakota where he graduated from high school and college. He then went on to teach and coach at Bowman, North Dakota and Lewistown, Montana, taking his Bowman team to the 1932 North Dakota State Class B Basketball Tournament.

He married Miriam Pardee, December 27, 1941, in Clinton Michigan. He came to Grand Forks in 1941 and opened the O. Lewis Ugland Insurance Agency.

He enlisted in the US Navy during World War II, and served from 1943 to 1946. He was commissioned a Lieutenant on December 3, 1943 and served as Communications Officer on the battleship USS South Dakota. After the war he reopened the insurance agency.

He is survived by his wife; son, Dr. Marvin L. (Galy) Fargo, North Dakota; stepgrandsons, Brad Johnson, Fargo, Matt (Amy) Johnson, Phoenix, Arizona; sisters, Mildred (Hollis) Ahrlin, Rapid City, South Dakota, Irene (Norman) Berg, Van Nuys, California; brother-in-law, Halvor Berg, Rapid City; and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his sister, Caroline Berg, Rapid City.

He served as Post Commander of American Legion Post 6, President of Grand Forks Country Club, Grand Forks Curling Club, and Kiwanis. He was a member of United Lutheran Church. He will be remembered for his love of family, life and keen sense of humor.
