

City Councilman Freeman Dies

Grand Forks City Councilman William Everett Freeman, 76, 1015 Cherry St., died Tuesday night at a local hospital where



he had been a patient since Feb. 21. Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Friday at Calvary Lutheran Church with Rev. Nelson F. Preus officiating.

Members of the City Council and city officials will attend the services in a group. Burial will be in Memorial Park Cemetery.

The body will lie in state Thursday evening at Hanson-Anderson Mortuary and Friday at the church for one hour before the time of services.

Mr. Freeman was serving his

second term as councilman from the city's Third Ward. He was first elected to office in 1964 and re-elected in 1968. Mr. Freeman's four-year term would have expired in April, 1972.

Mr. Freeman was born Feb. 21, 1904, in Grand Forks. He grew up here and was a graduate of Grand Forks Central High School. He was a lifelong Grand Forks city resident. Mr. Freeman had been engaged in farming in rural Grand Forks until 1932 and then established a carpenter contracting business. He had been semi-retired until recent months.

Mr. Freeman married the former Julia Hagen on Nov. 21, 1927, in East Grand Forks.

Previous to Mr. Freeman's election to the City Council he had served on township and school boards in Grand Forks County. He was a member of the City Council's Public Service Committee.

Mr. Freeman was a member of Calvary Lutheran Church.

Surviving are his wife; one daughter, Mrs. Arthur (Ruth) Moe, Michigan, D.D., and four grandchildren.
